Dear Friends,

After the resounding success of the first **BARICON** held in year 2016, it gives us great pleasure to announce the **AIIMS BARICON – 2nd International Conference on Bariatric and Metabolic Surgery** to be held on **13th to 16th November** in New Delhi. There are many conferences being held in Bariatric Surgery all across India but the AIIMS assurance of a great scientific content and inclusion of only reputed and experienced faculty as speakers is what makes this conference different. The theme of the Congress is "Management of Complications". The efficacy of bariatric surgery is well established. They will be mentored by experienced faculty with ample time for one to one interaction. Earlier this year, we had organized the first cadaver course on Bariatric Surgery in India which was highly appreciated. On the 2nd day Operative workshop is planned with a variety of cases which will be performed by experienced faculty from India and abroad. The next two days are dedicated to debates and discussions with emphasis on evidence based management of complications. We have excellent speakers with most of them having a huge experience and publications in bariatric surgery. There will be a session on manuscript writing and paper publishing as well. In order to encourage presentation of high quality research work, we have made a provision for 20 bursaries for young surgeons in the form of stay at venue hotel and complimentary registration.

November is an excellent time to visit Delhi and weather is at its best with the onset of winter season. The venue of the main congress is Hotel Pride Plaza in the buzzing Aerocity, close to Airport. There are lots of cafes and shopping malls just across the venue. The Airport Express can take you to heart of Delhi in 20 minutes.

Abstract Guidelines

- ❖ The title of the abstract should be less than 30 words.
- ❖ The body of the abstract must be concise with less than 350 words. The abstract system will not accept abstracts that exceed 350 words (body of the abstract).
- ❖ The abstract must have following sections:
 - Background / introduction
 - Objectives
 - Methods
 - Results
 - Conclusion
- ❖ There are three types of presentation available
 - Oral
 - Video
 - Poster
- ❖ Please note that selecting oral will not ensure your abstract is considered for oral presentation. As presentation slots are limited and the abstract may be reallocated for poster presentation.
- ❖ Please ensure that you indicate the presenting author on the abstract. If the submitting author is also the presenting author then please mark this as the presenting author.
- ❖ Tables must be attached into the body of the abstract – a maximum of 2 can be submitted. Please note that inserting tables will reduce your word capacity.
- ❖ Videos – Please submit - along with your VIDEO - the textual abstract, following the Abstract Format instructions above. Maximum size of the video: 500MB. Acceptable video formats are: .mp4 or .m4v
- ❖ Videos should be in a standardized format:
 - Video title
 - Clinical presentation and indication for surgery
 - Preoperative x-ray images/endoscopy/blood results
 - Operative procedure
 - Postoperative outcome
- ❖ Videos must not exceed 10 minutes in length. Do not include authors or affiliation in the video or body of abstract.
- ❖ Careful proof reading and typing are essential, as otherwise the abstract may be amended or rejected.
- ❖ Results reported using statements such as "results will be presented" or "data will be analysed" will not be accepted.
- ❖ A maximum of 5 abstracts will be accepted per presenting author. Those who have already reached this number can only be listed as co-author.
- ❖ There are no limits of authors per abstract.



Abstract Submission

- ✧ **Abstract Submission Deadline: October 10, 2019**
- ✧ **Abstract Acceptance: October 20, 2019**

PLACES TO VISIT IN DELHI



A fine example of early Afghan architecture, its construction started immediately after the defeat of the last Hindu kingdom in Delhi in 1193 as a symbol of victory. It is

surrounded by several other ancient and medieval structures and ruins, collectively known as the Qutb complex.



The India Gate is the national monument of India. Situated in the heart of New Delhi, the India Gate was designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens,

inspired by the Arc de Triomphe in Paris. It was built in 1931.



A 17th century fort complex, constructed in the walled city of Old Delhi, it dates from the very peak of Mughal Power. Built by the Mughal Emperor,

Shahjahan in 1648, it is a grandiose of pomp and power. Designated as the UNESCO World heritage site, the planning and aesthetics of this Fort represent the zenith of Mughal creativity which prevailed during the reign of Emperor Shah Jahan.



The Bahai House of Worship in New Delhi is popularly known as the Lotus Temple due to its flower-like shape. It was completed in 1986

and serves as the Mother Temple of the Indian subcontinent. It has won numerous architectural awards and has been featured in hundreds of newspaper and magazine articles.



Declared as UNESCO world heritage site, it was commissioned in 1562 AD by the Mughal Ruler, Humayun's grieving widow. It was the first mature example of Mughal architecture and

the first structure to use red sand tone at such a scale.



Also referred to as Delhi Akshardham or Swaminarayan Akshardham, the complex displays millennia of traditional Indian

and Hindu culture, spirituality, and architecture.
